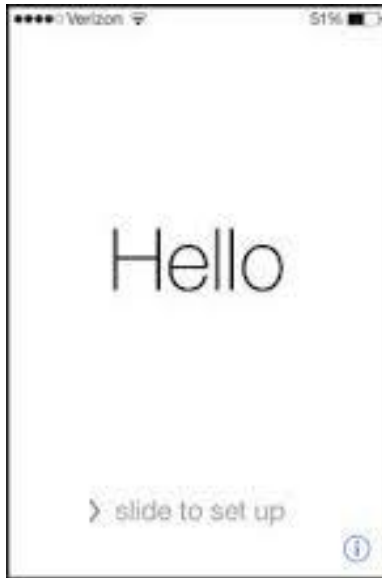


## Appendix II – iPad Initial Set-up

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### 1.1 TURN ON THE IPAD

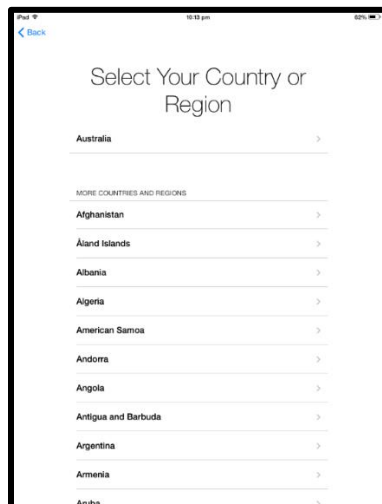
1. Hold the **Sleep/Wake** button. You'll see "Hello".



2. Slide from left to right anywhere on this screen.

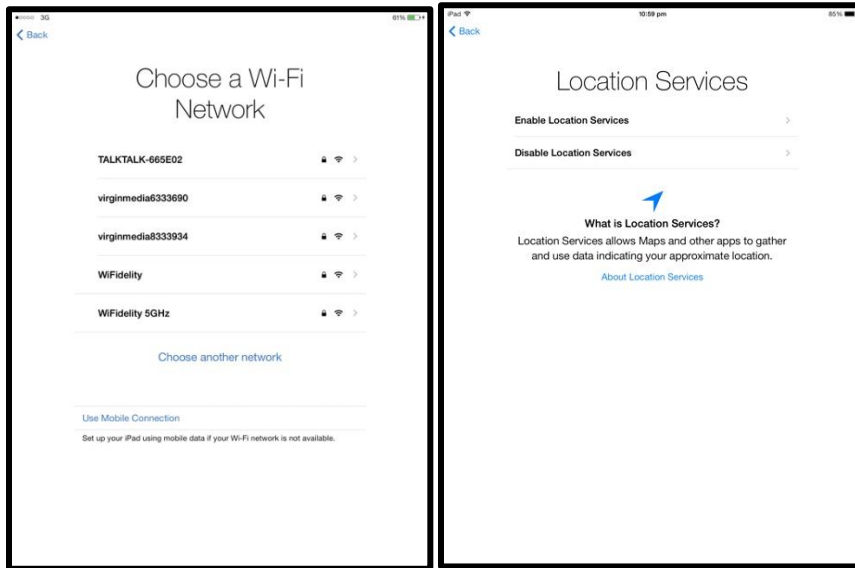
### 1.2 SELECT YOUR LANGUAGE AND COUNTRY

1. When asked, choose your language. Then tap your country or region. This affects how information will look on your device, including date, time, contacts, and more.



### 1.3 CHOOSE A WI-FI NETWORK AND CHOOSE LOCATION SERVICES

1. Tap a Wi-Fi network to connect. All nearby Wi-Fi networks should display. If the network you need is not displayed, tap **Choose another network** (in this case, you will need to enter more details about the network).
2. Then tap on **Enable Location Services** or **Disable Location Services**. This feature allows apps such as Maps to use your current location to provide more relevant content.



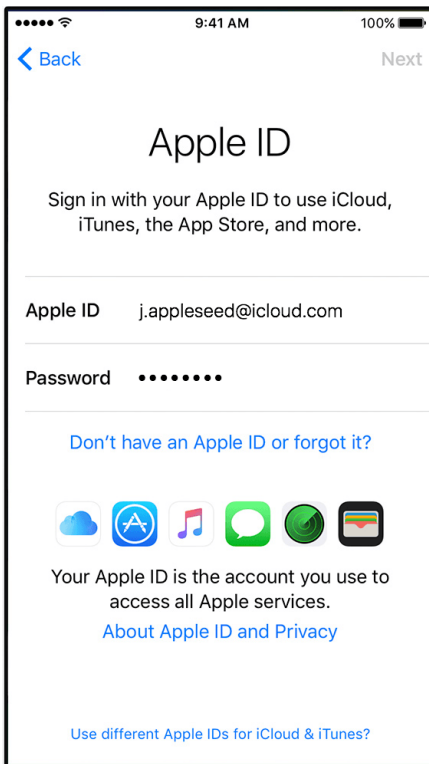
### 1.4 CREATE A PASSCODE

1. On some of the newest devices, you can set up Touch ID. With this feature, you can use your fingerprint to unlock your device and make purchases.
2. Next, set a four-digit passcode (PIN) to help protect your device from unwanted access. If you don't add a passcode, anyone who picks up your iPad can access all your apps and features.



## 1.5 SIGN IN WITH YOUR APPLE ID AND SET UP ICLOUD DRIVE

1. Enter your Apple ID and password.
2. To skip this step, or if you don't have an Apple ID, tap **Don't have an Apple ID or forgot it.**

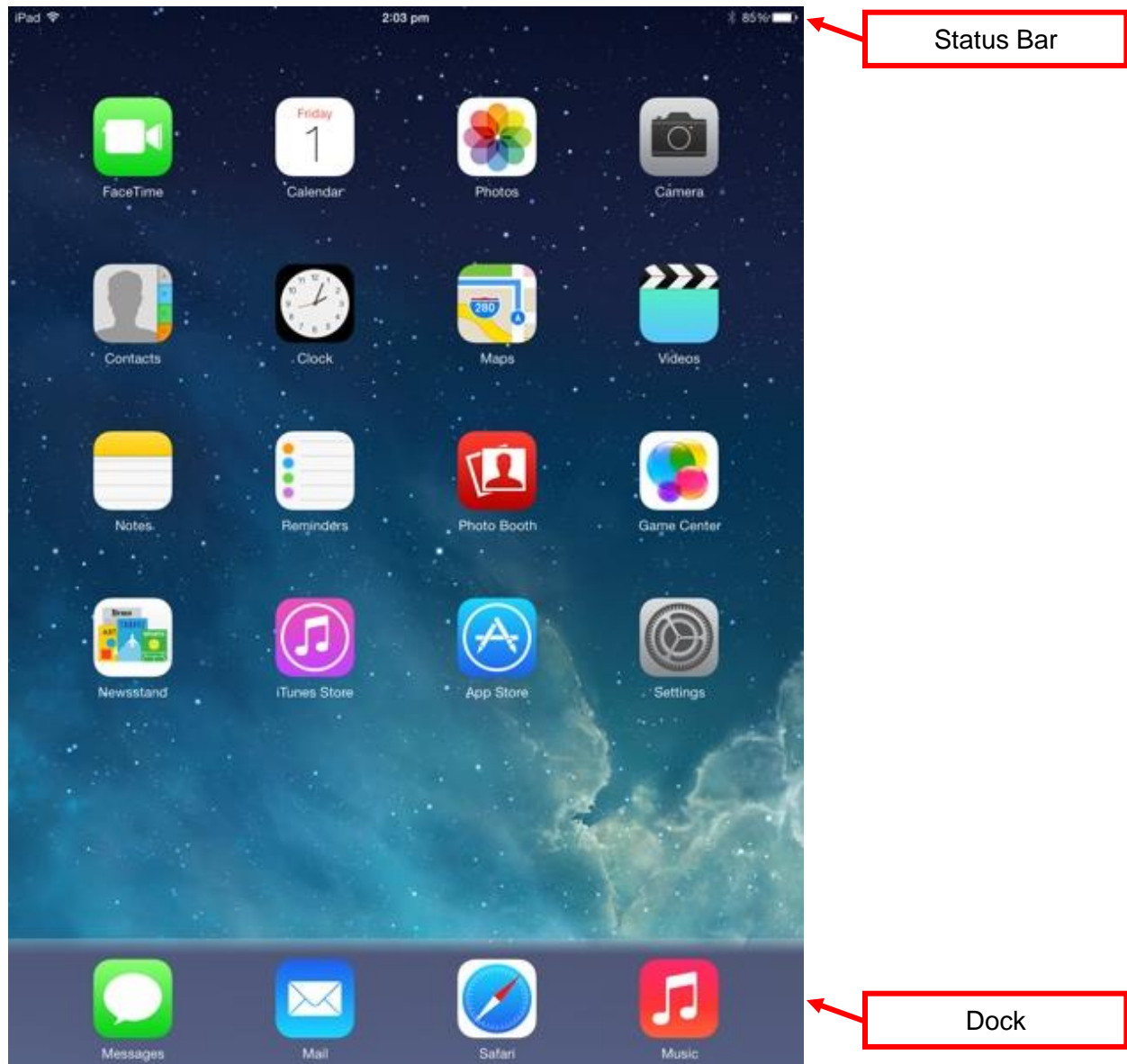


3. If you use more than one ID, tap **Use different Apple IDs for iCloud and iTunes.**

4. Next, if you've signed in with your Apple ID and created a passcode, you might be asked to set up iCloud Drive, Apple Pay, and iCloud Keychain.

Your iPad is now ready to use and the Home Screen will display.

## 1.6 THE HOME SCREEN



### Status bar

Across the top of the screen, it shows the Wi-Fi connection, current time, if Location Services is turned on and the current battery status.

### Dock

Across the bottom of the screen, it shows a few frequently-used applications. The default apps that show here are:

<b>Safari</b>	This is the default web browser for the iPad.
<b>Mail</b>	The mail application can be set up through settings. It supports Gmail, Yahoo mail, Hotmail, AOL mail and most other forms of email. The Mail app has a universal view that shows all of your incoming email as well as the inboxes broken out by the specific email address.
<b>Photos</b>	Where do all those photos go that you take with the Camera and Photo Booth? They go to an internal folder that can be accessed with the Photos app.
<b>Music</b>	The music app will let you play music downloaded through the iTunes store or synced from your computer. You can also play music on your PC without syncing to iTunes by using Home Sharing.

### 1.1.1. Control Centre



The Control Centre gives you instant access to a number of features to control how your iPad works. Swipe up from the bottom of any screen to open the Control Centre to adjust the following features (available features may vary depending on your iOS version and settings):

<b>Music</b>	Start, stop or change tracks.
<b>Airplane mode</b>	Turn off all communications (Wi Fi, Bluetooth, data).
<b>Wi-Fi</b>	Turn Wi Fi on or off.
<b>Bluetooth</b>	Turn Bluetooth on or off.
<b>Do Not Disturb</b>	Prevents all incoming communications and notifications.
<b>Rotation Lock or Mute</b>	Depending on how your settings for the Side Switch are set, you will have either of these functions – to lock the rotation of your screen or mute the sound.
<b>Brightness</b>	Adjust the brightness of your screen depending on the lighting levels in your area.
<b>Volume</b>	Increase or decrease volume of apps.
<b>AirDrop</b>	Share files with other devices that are connected.
<b>AirPlay</b>	Live stream audio, video, device screens, and photos, on another device such as AppleTV.
<b>Timer</b>	Set a timer or alarm, check the time in another location or start/stop a stopwatch.
<b>Nightshift</b>	Reduces the amount of blue light emitted by a device's display to reduce the sleep disturbance often created by late-night browsing.
<b>Camera</b>	Starts the camera for taking photos or videos.
